“The full party of Fraser Gallop’s Parterre cabernet sauvignon includes minor appearances from petit verdot, merlot, Malbec and cabernet franc. It spends 18 months in all-French oak, all of it either new or one-year-old. Elegance is the dominant theme but it’s bold enough to underline it’s premium status. This wine will be a charming addition to any cellar. It’s medium in weight, framed by tannin, touched by aromatic bay leaf and gravel notes and juiced up with boysenberry and blackcurrant. There’s almost a jubeyness here and yet it also feels dry and dusty. Smoky oak makes a positive contribution; it’s slowly sinking down into the wine. Detail. Finesse. This wine provokes such words.”
